September is coming, and we are excited for the new school year! The teachers are preparing curriculum, new educational toys have been purchased, and in-house field trips are planned.

This year the state and the federal government have implemented new rules for preschools and Child Care Centers which hold them to a higher standard. Fortunately, most of the changes have been part of our Center policies for many years. There are no changes to our daily operations or to the children's schedule. However, we have updated our Parent Handbook so it is clear and concise and includes the buzz words the government is looking for. For example, M.M.R. immunizations are mandatory, and science and math are now called S.T.E.M., which stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math.

All families will need to fill out a new enrollment packet to enroll their children for the fall. This packet will include our health policies, a new Parent Handbook, and updated tuition rates. We will be emailing the new information packet to you before August 15. Please read, sign, and return the forms by September 2. You can either email the forms to us or print and turn them into Julie. can you think of additional words that rhyme?




